


Here's Why You Should Donate to the LCCTF:

By the Numbers






During the 2023-2024 school year, funds from the ExtraGive contributed to:

- \$36,000 in scholarships awarded for LCCTC students moving on to Higher Education;
- \$23,000 in workforce grants for LCCTC students to purchase tools, uniforms and materials for start of new career after graduation;
- \$10,000 in financial assistance for high school students needing uniforms, tools, and certification fees;
- \$180,000 awarded for Teacher Innovation Grants for the purchase of equipment and supplies to enhance curriculum for a number of LCCTC programs.

LCCTF Workforce Grant Awardee: Samantha Fawcett

Medical Assistant, Penn Manor School District



Since she was little, Samantha Fawcett knew she wanted to be a neurosurgeon. The medical field fascinated her, and the CTC offered hands-on experience before entering college. Samantha enrolled in the half-day Intro to Healthcare Careers course in her Junior year, and her instructor, Mrs. Miller, recommended the Medical Assistant program for her Senior year. Samantha was surprised by all of the skills students learned in the MA program, and she especially enjoyed phlebotomy and administering EKGs. Outside of the MA program, Samantha was involved in the Willow Street SkillsUSA chapter and served as the Treasurer and Secretary during her time at the CTC. This experience helped her become close with students in other programs, and she expects the leadership training to be beneficial throughout her career. Following her childhood dream, Samantha was ambitious about her plans following high school graduation. She planned to attend Elizabethtown College and eventually go on to the Penn State MD program in Hershey. However, Samantha was fervent that the CTC gave her the head start she needed for her academic and medical career, noting: "The (MA) program is a great opportunity for hands-on learning and gives you something to be proud of; I went to high school and did an EKG, not many kids can say that."
