## Dear Student and Parent/Guardian

On behalf of the teachers and staff of the Mount Joy Career and Technology Center, I would like to welcome you to our school and the Advanced Health Careers Program. I am anxious to meet you and be your instructor as you learn about the healthcare field and explore what career you would like to pursue after graduation. During this year of instruction, we will explore Health Safety, Professional Ethics, Legal Aspects of Healthcare, Medical Terminology, and Anatomy & Physiology. These subjects are fundamental to all healthcare professions. There will be presentations by various healthcare professionals, and you will have the opportunity to observe different clinical areas in Lancaster County. All these experiences will help you make your career choice.

During this school year, you will be given the opportunity to study basic medical concepts and careers in the medical field and allied health industry. Medical terminology will be taught in conjunction with HACC in the Allied Health 105 (3 credits) and Allied Health 140 (3 credits) portion of the class. The HACC-accredited class is called College in the High School and offers students the opportunity to earn (6) transferable college credits. There may also be other opportunities to earn more HACC credits. Information will be given to students at the start of school in the Fall.

Another essential aspect of this program is the opportunity you will be given to job shadow professionals. There will be numerous job shadowing experiences of two days, each arranged for the student in various departments of the hospital and other facilities. Your observations will include healthcare professionals performing duties specific to their job description and interacting with their clients. Due to patient interaction, the following requirements are mandated but are subject to change according to the specific medical facilities: a negative two-step TB test or a QuantiFERON Gold <u>lab blood test</u>. This specific lab test must be within 3 months of clinical start (recommended to get in mid to late September), a Flu vaccination in the Fall, a Covid vaccination (Penn Medicine facilities), and an updated immunization record (copy) are required before the start of class (See attachment).
