BY THE NUMBERS





During the 2024-2025 school year, funds from the ExtraGive contributed to:

- \$36,000 in scholarships awarded for LCCTC students moving on to Higher Education;
- \$30,000 in workforce
 grants for LCCTC students to
 purchase tools, uniforms, and
 materials for the start of a new
 career after graduation;
- \$15,000 in financial assistance for high school students needing uniforms, tools, and certification fees;
- \$150,000 in Teacher
 Innovation Grants for the
 purchase of equipment and
 supplies to enhance our
 curriculum for a number of
 LCCTC programs.
