	<p>emotional support teachers support their students in all programs throughout the building. Paraeducators may support 7-10 programs. The learning center is available at designated times for testing accommodations, study groups, work completion support, and instructional groups on IEP goal areas. Time spent in the learning center limits time spent in labs, so students must make the most of their brief time in the learning center. Services are at an itinerant level. IU13 teachers and paraeducators are unable to be in every program all day due to the itinerant nature. It is not a co-taught structure.</p>
