We look forward to the start of the 2026–2027 school year. Students enrolled in the Introduction to Transportation Careers program will explore the fundamentals of automotive mechanics and small engine repair. Throughout the course, students will develop practical skills in tool and equipment use, shop safety, and basic repair procedures that are essential for success in the transportation industry.

To maintain a safe and productive learning environment, a dress code and strict laboratory rules will be enforced. Students are expected to demonstrate appropriate behavior, use respectful language, and properly operate all tools and equipment. Student conduct expectations, shop procedures, and safety rules will be thoroughly reviewed during the first week of class. The CTC provides textbooks, tool kits, and safety glasses; however, there are several items students must obtain prior to the start of school.

Students must comply with the LCCTC uniform requirement. Introduction to Transportation Careers students are required to wear navy blue Dickies brand pants and maroon LCCTC t-shirts, long-sleeved t-shirts, and crewneck sweatshirts. Jeans, cowboy boots, hooded sweatshirts, and hats are not permitted within the school building. Hats may only be worn in the lab area.

Uniform shirts must be ordered from Fully Promoted through the LCCTC website school store (www.lancasterctc.edu). Students are expected to arrive in full uniform on the first day of school. Pants must be purchased independently over the summer and are commonly available at retailers such as Walmart or local hardware stores. Jeans, shorts, and capris are not permitted. Pants must be properly fitted, and baggy clothing is not allowed due to safety concerns when working with tools, equipment, and machinery.

It is recommended that students purchase at least two pairs of pants and five shirts, including one sweatshirt. Students must also obtain leather work shoes, with steel-toed shoes strongly preferred, which may be purchased at a retailer of your choice.

Students are also encouraged to participate in the student organization SkillsUSA. SkillsUSA provides students with opportunities to develop leadership, workplace, and technical skills while preparing them to become responsible and skilled members of the workforce. Students who choose to participate will be required to pay a membership fee.

In addition, students are required to bring a three-ring binder with lined paper, as well as a separate notebook for maintaining a daily journal, on the first day of school.
